Sour Cream Coconut Cake

(Marsha Lee gave this recipe to Pam Crawford)

Cake

1 box yellow cake mix

Bake as directed on package for two layers and allow to cool.

Topping

2 cups sugar

2 cups sour cream

18 oz frozen coconut (plus extra package if you want to pat on outside of cake)

Cool Whip, small and thawed

Mix topping well and spread between layers. For the remaining topping, add just enough cool whip to give body for the topping to stay on sides of cake.

Then spread the topping/cool whip on outside of cake. If desired, take extra package of frozen coconut to pat on top and sides of cake.

Put cake in air tight container and freeze or wait three days before cutting to give cake time to get moist.
